The Rescue of Science, Learning, and the Arts

Tuesday, August 1st @ 1:00 PM

Allan E. Goodman, President and CEO of the Institute of International Education (IIE), will speak about his organization's work and vision, especially with Education in Emergencies and rescuing threatened students, scholars, and artists in foreign nations, and giving them sanctuary and new places and resources to pursue their work. Be the threat from war, natural disaster, or political unrest, IIE has set up several funds and programs so these individuals can pursue their works in safety, share them with the community, and hopefully return to their respective countries once the unrest has settled down. Scholars in this program are among 78 other individuals associated with IIE to have received Nobel Prizes.

Musical Origins and the Stone Age Evolution of Flutes

Composed by Lampert, this commission for strings and flute will feature Atema using an ancient flute – discovered in recent excavations – that he reconstructed using the flute's original material, deer bone. In this talk Atema and Lampert will touch upon the origins of music and the Stone Age evolution of flutes.
